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Launch of the first European induced pluripotent stem cell bank

The UK Stem Cell Bank at NIBSC is a key partner in a new project <u>EBiSC</u>, to establish a repository for human iPSC lines for Europe as outlined in the attached press release. The UKSCB will be responsible for establishing the quality control and characterisation of <u>EBiSC</u> cell banks and also for setting up training programmes for <u>EBiSC</u> staff, in collaboration with

Roslin Cells. This bank will make a significant contribution to the broader application of iPSC lines in biomedical research and in particular to the development of new drugs and their safety screening. Read more...

Open access to a new toxicology database supporting development of stem cell-based assays <u>Seurat-1</u> is a large scientific consortium funded by the European Commission and the Cosmetics trade

organisation <u>Cosmetics Europe</u>. One of the central consortia in this multi-consortium cluster, <u>ToxBank</u> is now making available a public version of the <u>ToxBank data warehouse</u> for the first time. This new version, which will be available for demonstration at Society of Toxicology (<u>SOT</u>), will allow access to public data resources relating to compound toxicology and protocols and materials for the development of stem cell-based assays. The <u>Joint Research Centre</u> in Ispra, Italy, has stepped forward to be the first SEURAT-1 partner to make data available in such a way in this first release. Such public data access follows a creative common approach that will hopefully drive new scientific capabilities in sharing and fully utilising data sets.
